THE CALL TO MISSIONS Every Neighbor, Every Nation

BIG IDEA: God calls us to change the world one person at a time and we start with our neighbor.

ICE BREAKER

1. Can you give the names of your immediate neighbors who live next to you?
2. Can you give any personal information about your neighbors? i.e. Hobbies, jobs, marriage, background etc.
3. Do you think your neighbors know Christ as their Lord and Savior?

THINK

1. What are some things you could do to begin developing a relationship with your neighbors?
2. What are some of the sacrifices you will have to make to develop these relationships?
3. What would it take for you to invite a neighbor or friend to join us on Easter Sunday?

EXAMINE

Answer the following questions after reading this passage. **Acts 17:26-28a** *From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. 27 God did this so that they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us. 28 For in him we live and move and have our being.*

1. Who is speaking in this passage and to whom is he speaking?
2. What are your thoughts about God marking out the nation's time in history?
3. What about the boundaries of the nations?
4. What are some of God's "*marked out*" and "*appointed times*" in the history of your life? i.e. life situations etc.
5. What are some of God's "*boundaries*" God has placed on your life? i.e. where you live etc.
6. What does that say about God's purpose for your life?
7. What does that say about who your neighbors are... coincidence? or God planned?
8. How does **verses 27 & 28** speak to God's purpose in putting you where you are in this life?
9. If you believe in God and believe He has a purpose for your life, how do you respond to your "*appointed times*" "*boundaries*"? Are they restrictions or opportunities?

THIS WEEK: Begin this week by asking yourself the following questions:

- What parts of my life situation has God's planned and what parts have I planned without God?
- What are the life situations that God is using to help me, "*seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him*"?
- How can I use these situations to give the Good News of Christ to a neighbor?
- What neighbor will I ask God to give me the courage to invite to our Easter service and family day?
